We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Laker High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Laker High School is dedicated and committed to challenge and encourage all students to reach their highest potential. Through a comprehensive curriculum and a caring educational environment, Laker students will be prepared to excel in a global society.

High School aged students residing in the Elkton, Pigeon and Bay Port communities are assigned in the appropriate grade. Students residing outside the Laker District may apply to attend via School of Choice.

Laker students continue to perform at or above the state in most state standardized assessments.

Laker High School receives tremendous support from the Laker parents and the surrounding community. Parent teacher conferences and the Student Showcase have a very impressive turnout.

a. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS

Forty-nine (49) students (17%) enrolled in at least three college level classes during that past semester with the opportunity to earn 9 credits at Mid-Michigan Community College.

b. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT. Overall seven hundred two (702)

college credits through Mid-Michigan Community College were earned with a cost savings of over \$132,000 to Laker students and families.
